anywhere in the country according to one Cincinnati newspaper). Council just decided that we would move back outside to the parking lot. I found the transmitter and all the parts and pieces we used just a short while ago. I'm racking my brain to make sure I remember how to conduct the worship service in the format we previously used. Quite honestly, it's sad, depressing, isolating and lonely. I text with a colleague recently about my current state of grief. He replied that God worked to save humanity through the death of Jesus, alone, on the cross. Then came the resurrection of Christ. As Christians, we draw hope from the new life found in the resurrected body of Christ. Edinburg United Church and other local churches might come out of this vastly different. But God's church will continue. COVID doesn't end God. Now more than ever in our history, we need community, love, warmth. This Advent season we will work on kindness.
